

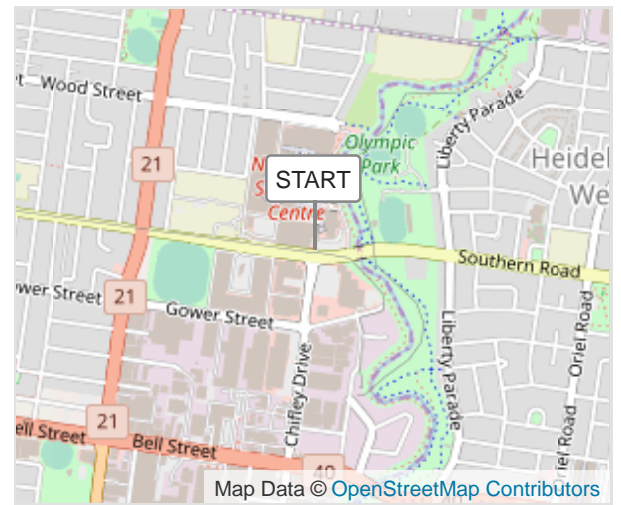


# Keep Moving Walk 7: Northland - Plenty Road

## NOTES

This is a pleasant walk of about 3km from Northland Shopping Centre along the Darebin Creek Trail to Plenty Rd near LaTrobe University.

The Darebin Creek Trail is well signed and has good surfaces of bitumen or concrete, with rest stops available along the way. The trail is mostly quite level, with some small rises along the path.

Access by public transport is good, with buses to Northland and trams along Plenty Road.

From the front of Northland Shopping Centre in Murray Rd, walk eastwards and cross over the Darebin Creek bridge, taking the path where it leads off to the left, just past the end of the bridge.

Then you can follow to Trail northwards, using the signposts at the various track junctions to keep on the main path all the way through to Plenty Rd. Tram stops on Plenty Road are about 200 metres to the left and to the right.

The trail can, of course, be walked in the other direction, starting at Plenty Rd and finishing at Northland for refreshments.

| No | Miles | Turn | Directions  |
|----|-------|------|---|
| 1  | 0.000 |      | Start near 1 Murray Rd, Preston   |
| 2  | 0.631 | ↖    | Slight left to stay on Darebin Creek Trail  |
| 3  | 0.891 | ←    | Turn left to stay on Darebin Creek Trail  |
| 4  | 1.010 | ↗    | Turn right to stay on Darebin Creek Trail   |
| 5  | 1.018 | ↖    | Turn left to stay on Darebin Creek Trail  |
| 6  | 1.738 |      | Slight left   |
| 7  | 1.746 | ↙    | Sharp left onto Darebin Creek Trail   |
| 8  | 1.889 |      | You can retrace your steps if you like to make a longer walk. Take it slowly and enjoy the creek! |
